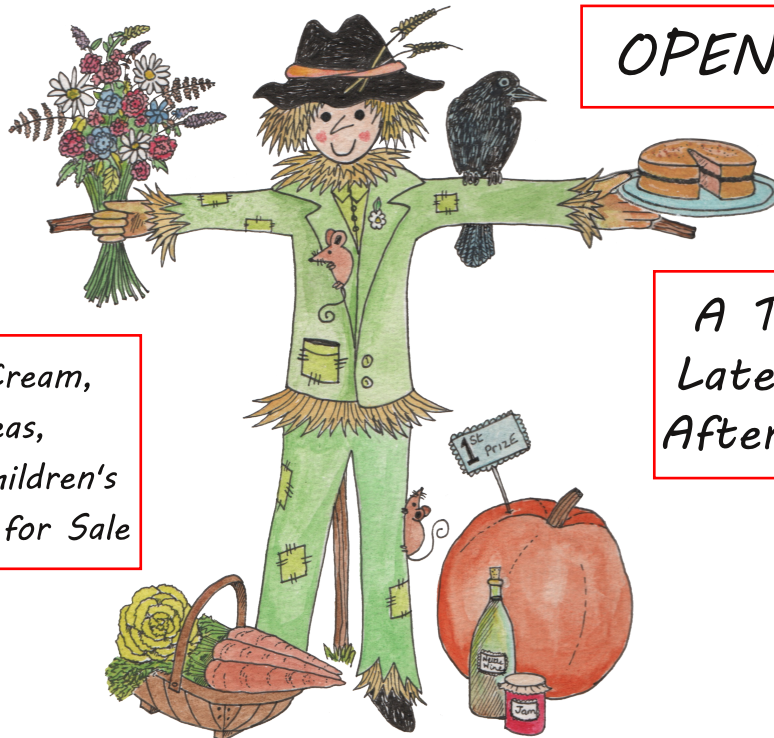

Show Rules And Regulations

1. Entries can either be made **online** or brought in person to Claverton Down Community Hall between **6pm and 8pm** on **Wednesday 3rd Sept 2025**. Entries must be on the official entry form and accompanied by the correct entry fee. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE.** Additional entry forms can be downloaded at **www.clavertonhortsoc.org**
2. Exhibits must be staged between **6pm and 7pm** on the evening before The Show or between **8am and 10.30am** on the day of The Show.
AT 10.30am THE SHOW MARQUEE WILL BE CLEARED FOR JUDGING.
3. Exhibitors Cards must be placed so that Exhibitor's number is face down on the table. If a card is omitted the entry will not be judged.
4. Exhibitors are reminded that **Not for Sale** stickers should be affixed to their exhibitors' cards if they **do not** wish these to be auctioned during the end of show Fundraiser Auction (children's classes will not be auctioned).
5. No person shall be allowed more than one entry in each class. EXHIBITS FROM PREVIOUS YEARS CANNOT BE RE-ENTERED.
6. All exhibits in classes 1-66 inclusive must be bona fide exhibitors own growing and in their possession at least two months before The Show. All horticultural exhibits will be judged according to RHS Rules
7. Any exhibitor attempting to obtain any prizes by fraud shall forfeit all prizes awarded to them at The Show. All protests shall be made in writing to the Show Secretaries before 3.30pm on the day with a fee of £1 which shall be forfeited to the funds of the Society if the protest is not upheld.
8. No exhibits or cards shall be removed until after the presentation of awards, except by specific permission of the Show Secretary.
9. No responsibility will be accepted for loss of or damage to any exhibit or other personal property.
10. Trophies will be presented at 4pm. Prize money can be collected when announced. Prize monies not claimed by 20th Sept 2025 from the Treasurer shall be deemed to be forfeited to the funds of the Society
- 11. The decision of the President shall be final and binding on all matters!**
